
Term 4 has been another momentous time for the Academy, navigating industrial action and adverse weather, however the remarkable

Principal Awards for Term 4







As part of Personal Development, students have been exploring a variety of personal development topics including Holocaust Memorial and Children's Mental Health Week.

Holocaust Memorial Week:

Hanham Woods Academy is a Beacon School for Holocaust education. This is a scheme. Run by University College London, in which we became involved in 2019. Although much of the Beacon School programme is about developing powerful schemes of work relating to the Holocaust (in this school, principally in History lessons, but also in Drama), the Beacon School programme has wider-ranging aims as well. These include embedding Holocaust education within a school's ethos and demonstrating the value of teaching and learning about the Holocaust to broader educational values such as SMSC; Global Learning; active, democratic citizenship; and pupils' development of independent and critical thinking. Holocaust memorial week is therefore a very important week for the academy and its students.

This year's Holocaust Memorial week assemblies and tutor time activities were being run by a small group of student leaders who have been working every Wednesday, with Miss Dora and the makers of the television documentary 'The Holocaust, My Family and Me.' In particular, the students have been researching the Holocaust story of the family of actress, Louisa Clein, who visited the students in school last summer.

Throughout the week students explored the Genocide Triangle , 10 stages of genocide , life before, during and after the Holocaust, rebel forces , Nazi views , other groups who were persecuted and the impact of the Holocaust & modern-day contributions of genocide.

Children's Mental Health Week:

Hanham Woods Academy have been taking part in Children's Mental Health Week (6th-10th February 2023). This year's theme is 'Let's Connect'.

'Let's Connect' is about making meaningful connections. People thrive in communities, and this connection is vital for our wellbeing. When we have healthy connections – to family, friends and others – this can support our mental health and our sense of wellbeing.

For Children's Mental Health Week 2023, we're encouraged people to connect with others in healthy, rewarding and meaningful ways.

Students have received a special assembly from Kooth and took part in a variety of Tutor Time activities and PSHE lessons centered around the 'Let's Connect' theme.



The first to get all 8 books on their card wins.



Trip to Shakespeare's Globe

On 8th March, Year 7 students visited The Globe Theatre in London to see William Shakespeare's play 'The Tempest'. The students were mesmerised by the production, which was specially created for young people. Despite the freezing conditions and surprise snowfall, students were brilliantly behaved and well prepared for the unique experience of watching a live performance in this historic theatre set next to the River Thames.

The play itself was updated through bright modern costumes and an unusual stage design. Actors would appear from all sorts of places around the theatre, and the whole audience jointed in enthusiastically with the jokes and romantic moments. But as always with Shakespeare, the star of the show was the beautiful language, and the Tempest has its fair share of famous lines, such as 'brave new world' and 'we are such stuff as dreams are made on...' This is a sword I made with no power tools it took time and effort but it was worth it.

First I selected a piece of wood and drew on the design then I cut it out with a handsaw. After that I carved round the edges making sure not to go too deep as I would ruin the blade. Next I sanded until smooth. Then I glued two pieces of wood onto the sides to add a bit more bulk to the handle then I painted it silver and put a black wash over to make it look more like steel. After that I wrapped the handle in red leather, gluing it on in a swirl pattern. To finish off the sword, I added a gemstone pommel using glue. For the sheaf I wrapped the sword in the leatherette and marked out how much material I would need, making sure I have enough to be able to draw the sword from the sheaf. After that I wrote (Romeo . M) onto the sheaf and sewed along the lettering. Last but not least I sewed along the edge

Teachers then select their entrants, make a simple video of their performances and upload them. Poetry by Heart's panel of expert judges then select pupils from every region of England to come and perform their poems and meet top UK poets at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre.

HWA has been extremely lucky to have the Director of Poetry by Heart – Julie Blake - leading the first three sessions, to help prepare students and get them ready to enter this year's competition. Students have been fantastic at preparing independently for the competition by selecting poems of their choice to learn off by heart and coming to the club after school on a Friday.

Students have recently started working on Script and Character whereby they have been delving into the world of Cinderella showing off a wide range of physical and vocal skills.




Alumni Work Experience Success


Ski Trip

This academic year we have been working with the Belmont Estate in Wraxall. They offered a 6 part intervention for 12 KS3 students to improve their wellbeing, attendance and engagement at the Academy.

Each termly visit sees the rewilding project on Watercress farm change its natural state and the visits offer us the opportunity to take part in safe play on the farm. It allows access to nature and provides immersive educational opportunities helping the students to become more connected with the natural world and the nature on the farm.


Enrichment

What is harmful sexual behaviour?

Harmful sexual behaviour has been defined as sexual behaviour by under-18s that is "developmentally inappropriate, may be harmful towards self or others and/or be abusive towards another child, young person or adult*. Those either exhibiting or being harmed by such behaviours may be male or female.

A UK survey found that 48% of 11-16-year-olds had viewed pornography – and among those who had done so, 34% reported seeing it once a week or more.

In a study of young people across Europe, boys who regularly watched online pornography were found to be significantly more likely to hold negative gender
