#### Why become a Student Senior Leader?

Student Senior Leaders play a vital part in the running of Hanham Woods Academy by assisting and supporting both staff and pupils. #### When can I become a Student Senior Leader?

We advertise for Student Senior Leadership Team applications during Term 6 for the next academic year.

We accept applications from KS4 students only, however, you need to be able to show you have the qualities, skills and experience to become a great Student Senior Leader!

Although the initial commitment to be a Student Senior Leader is one year, you are able to re-apply to continue representing your school and community should you wish to do so.

#### Homelessness within the LGBT+ community

Homelessness means not having a reliable place to call home. There are many misconceptions and misunderstanding about homeless people. These stereotypes are damaging and can hinder homeless people from getting back on their feet.

According to the charity Shelter, how many homeless people do you estimate to be in the UK?

A) 115,000

B) 203,000

C) 320,000

If you guessed C, you would unfortunately be correct.

People often think that homelessness just means sleeping on the streets but you can be homeless even if you have a roof over your head.

You count as homeless if you are:

- · staying with friends or family
- staying in a hostel, night shelter or B&B
- at risk of violence or abuse in your home
- living in poor conditions that affect your health
- living apart from your family because you don't have a place to live together.

According to Stonewall, almost one in five LGBT people (18 per cent) have experienced homelessness at some point in their lives.

At HWA, we know that these statistics are unacceptable and we want to do everything in our power to help reduce this.



## Become a WE read Decome a Student Librarian


