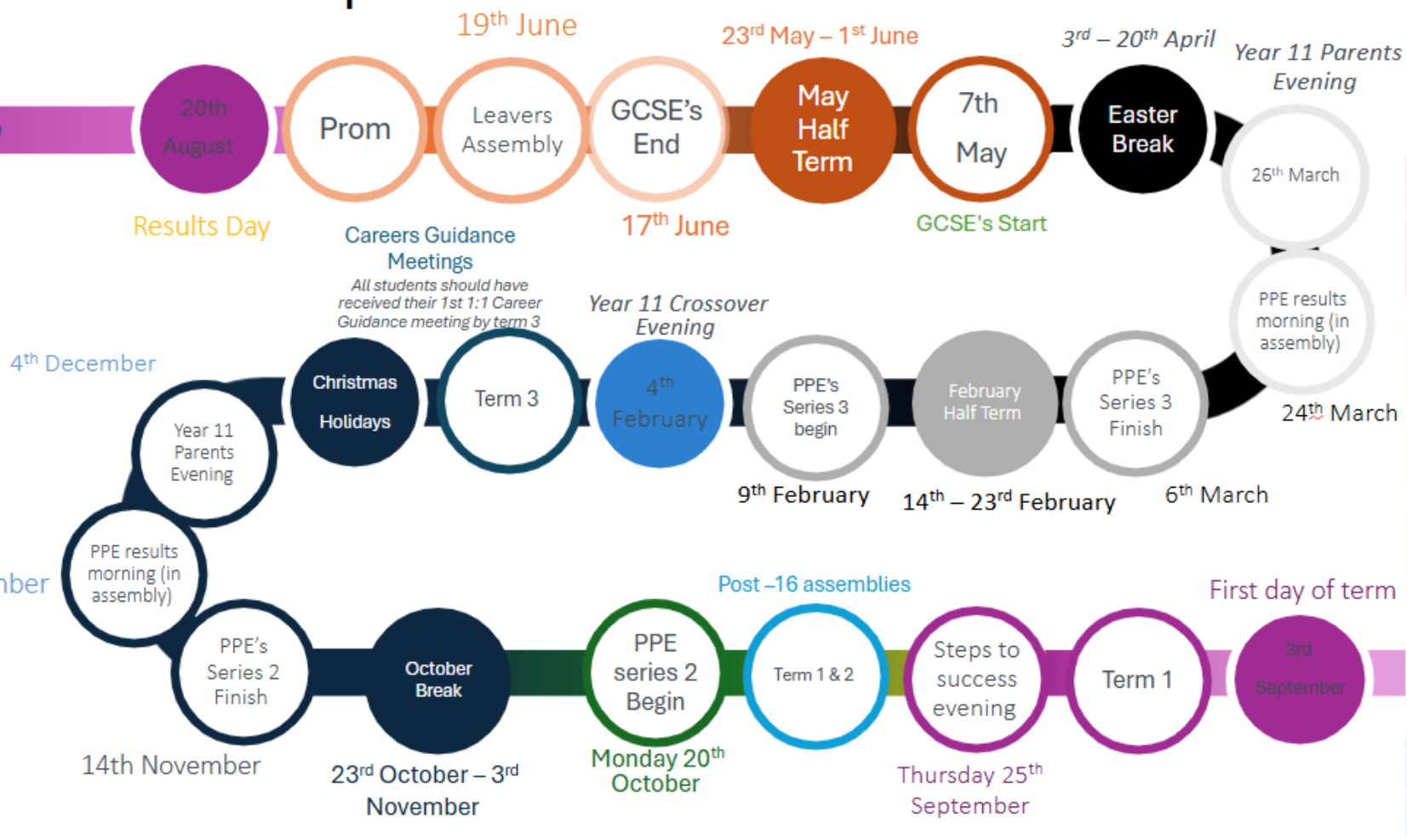

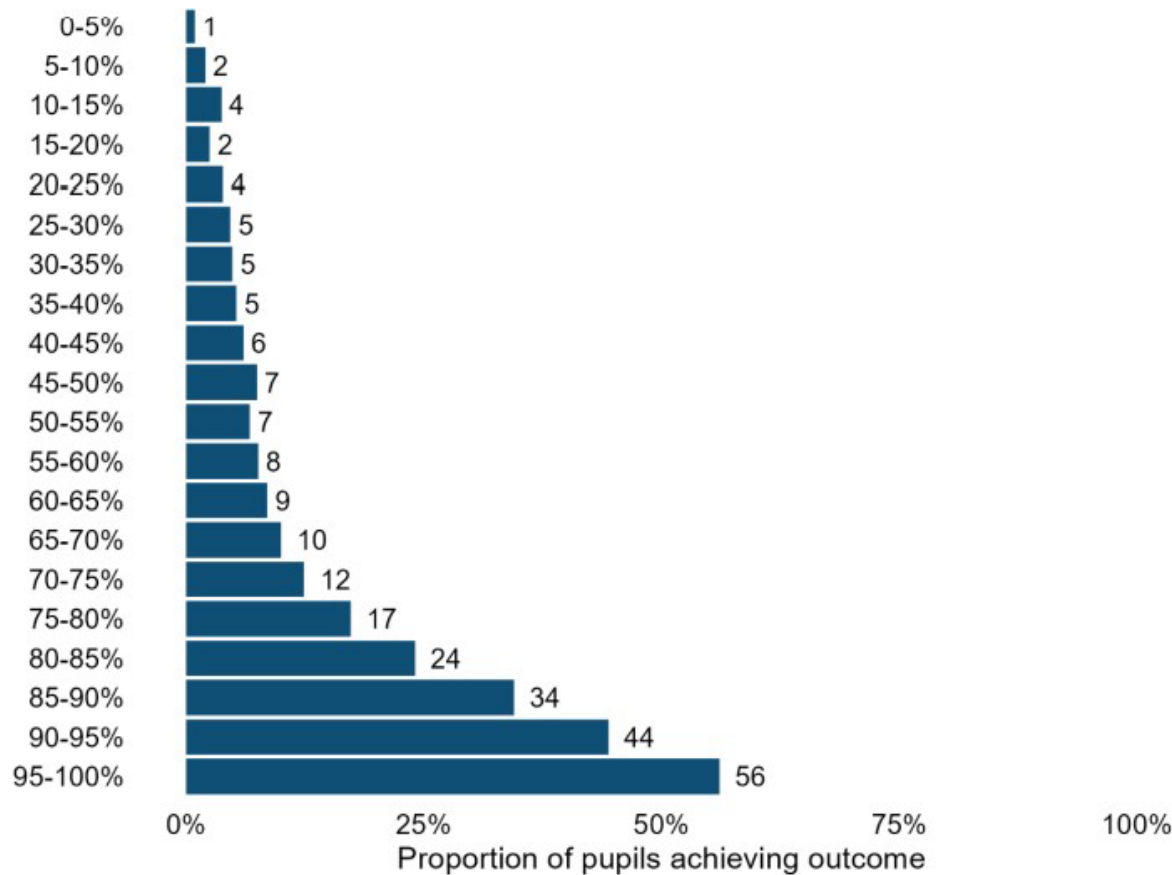

What makes for impactful revision?

Each revision slot should last around 25/30 minute chunks and should consist of the following three options:

1. **Self-quizzing:** look - write - cover - check, or writing quiz questions based on knowledge you need to learn. (Flashcards)
2. **Exam drills and practice questions.** You should aim to complete at least 1 timed mock paper/question at home for every subject you have an exam for so some slots might have to be longer than 25/30 minutes.
3. **Use of online revision platforms such as Seneca and Sparx** (extra to set homework)


If you have outstanding coursework/NEA work you could also spend one of your three sessions on completing assignments or coursework

Supporting teen anxiety

- Parents are often in a better position than therapists to put strategies in place and create opportunities for new learning in their child's day-to-day life
- Parents can sometimes put strategies in place across the family
- Parents are likely to remember what has been helpful in months and years to come and so can put strategies in place again if needed
- Social, academic and body anxiety are all relatively common. It is important not to diagnose a child with anxiety as this is not always the case.
- Children will look to parents to model responses to stress and worry. Talking about your thought processes is hugely beneficial.
