

## The Glastonbury Festival

The Glastonbury Festival, often simply called Glastonbury, is one of the most famous music and performing arts festivals in the world. It takes place almost every year in Pilton, a small village in Somerset, England. The festival was first held in 1970, the day after legendary musician Jimi Hendrix died. Back then, tickets cost just £1, and festival-goers got free milk from the farm where the event was held!

Today, Glastonbury has grown into a huge event that attracts more than 200,000 people. The festival is well known for its large stages, especially the Pyramid Stage, where top musicians and bands perform. Many different genres of music are represented at Glastonbury, including rock, pop, hip-hop, electronic, and folk. There are also areas for theatre, circus performances, and spoken word events.

Glastonbury is about more than just music. It supports many charities and has a strong focus on the environment. Recycling, reducing waste, and using renewable energy are important parts of the festival's mission. Many festival-goers camp in tents on the site for several days, no matter what the weather is like—rain or shine!

Because the festival is so popular, tickets usually sell out within minutes of being released. People often plan months in advance to be part of the experience. For many, Glastonbury is not just a music festival, but a once-in-a-lifetime adventure.
